COMMUNITY TO GATHER, PROVIDE FEEDBACK TO SHAPE FUTURE OF DEKALB'S FIRST BLACK PUBLIC SCHOOL *Effort to Activate Landmark of Black Education Continues*

On **Sunday, Feb. 27, from 1-4pm**, community members will gather to shape the future of the remnants of DeKalb County's first Black public school, the [Bruce Street School](#). The event will take place at the Arabia Mountain Heritage Area Alliance, **3350 Klondike Road, Stonecrest, GA 30038**. Free parking is available onsite. This event is the third in a series designed to gather community feedback and direct the reactivation of the school site. The event will be led by Martin Rickles Studio, an Atlanta-based interdisciplinary design studio; staff from the Arabia Mountain Heritage Area Alliance; and volunteers.


Also known as the Lithonia Negro School and the Lithonia Colored School, the Bruce Street School was built and run by Lithonia's Black community prior to integration. The school's first graduating high school class (around 1943) included three pupils. By 1968, when the Bruce Street School was closed, there were over a dozen elementary and eight high school classrooms – several outbuildings, now lost, had to be constructed in order to support the growing student body. The school building contains a rich history, and now people have an opportunity to determine how this space can become an active part of the community once again. Outreach events for this phase of the project will continue throughout spring of 2022 and culminate in June.

The focus of this session is to begin the process of mapping out what community members would like to do at the Bruce Street School site in the future – once planners understand the community's needs and expectations, they will adjust their recommendations for renovating, preserving and otherwise activating the site accordingly. Planning is underway to include a virtual component for people who cannot attend in person; more information about the virtual component will be forthcoming.

This project is a collaboration between the City of Lithonia, DeKalb County, and the Arabia Mountain Heritage Area Alliance. Funding has been provided by DeKalb County District 5 Commissioner Mereda Davis Johnson.

Anyone with artifacts related to the Bruce Street School – including photos, records, yearbooks and stories to use in potential exhibits – is especially encouraged to join the community engagement sessions.

The DeKalb Beloved Naturalist Program (DBN) will facilitate a unique and exciting Nature-based learning experience for people representing diverse ages, cultures, racial and ethnic backgrounds. Our proposed partners include the Amphibian Foundation, Arabia Mountain Heritage Area Alliance, Awali Agricultural Center, Chattahoochee Nature Center, DeKalb County, Georgia Audubon, South Fork Conservancy, West Atlanta Watershed Alliance and public and private universities.



DeKalb's Beloved Naturalists filled the room at Arabia Mountain with twenty eager naturalists, diverse in age, gender and color, and united in listening with fresh ears to stories of their environmental heritage.

Leslie Edwards, author, Ph.D. and professional educator, started with a look out the window. Bare February trees, empty bushes, a stretch of exposed rock with little to see. Do you know how rare this sight is? She challenged the room. This common Dekalb County scenery she called rare in the whole world, temperate deciduous piedmont forests, filled once a year with a priceless nutritional bath from dropping leaves. A global map of habitat zones proved her right. Only tiny portions of the world hold this unique combination. And then she smiled in triumph. Even better, our very own temperate deciduous forest has NEVER BEEN SCoured BY A GLACIER! Just like that, the common was elevated. Her hike expose discoveries on the quarry surface and in the woods.

Many ideas came from class members sharing their own knowledge, naming birdsong by ear, and tadpoles by sight. The class took hints from Dr. Edwards about lectures ahead from other scientists and leaders, including urban agriculture, indigenous botany, lichens, stream banks, birds and amphibians.

The once a month field trips and lectures are sponsored by partnerships with conservation organizations working together with DeKalb County park rangers in concert with Arabia Mountain National Heritage Area.
