MINUTES–SPECIAL CALLED MOVIE PRODUCTION “HEELS” VIRTUAL MEETING

Thursday, October 15, 2020 @ 3:00 PM

I. Call to Order and Roll Call

The City Council Work Session Virtual Meeting was called to order at 5:04 pm by Mayor Shameka S. Reynolds. A roll call was taken and the following City Council Members were present: Diane Howard, Darold Honore, Vanneriah Wynn, and Ric Dodd. Amelia Inman was absent.

III. Discussion

a. Film Application for Movie Production Heels

Ellen and Jamaal provided presentation; prep work starts October 16 at the Massey House, thereafter on Sunday October 18, and Monday October 19, filming on Tuesday October 20 and wrapping up on Wednesday October 21. Additionally, requesting 3 days for usage of the Masonic Lodge, usage of the Wiggins Lot for catering on Tuesday October 20. Mayor and Council are in agreement to approve filming for the movie production Heels.

b. Offer on City Property

Councilwoman Howard has a personal interest to make an offer on one of the city properties (Covington Highway). Mr. Jhavaun Green verified that LDDA manages the sale of the property; Councilwoman Howard would then make an offer, LDDA makes the recommendation to council, council then votes on it in an open meeting.

c. Business License Renewal – ~~Zoning~~ Code Enforcement Guidelines

Councilwoman Howard and Councilman Honore are seeking to introduce guidelines for Code Enforcement on lots that house cars. Furthermore, business license renewals would be revoked until the car lots are up to code. Councilman Honore wants the attorney to review and update the ordinance with the legal language necessary.
